Councilmember David McClain said he had a couple of questions for Community Development Director Tiffny Calloway. Are there metrics that they have to hit? Ms. Calloway said, in the contracts, it talks about what those requirements are and those are on Legistar. In order to qualify, a business has to be located within the city limits of Jonesboro. That is the first qualification. They must be for-profit, so they are in the business to make money. The second qualification is that they have to provide a good or a service to someone who is low to moderate income in the city limits of Jonesboro. If they don't provide a good or a service, they can employee someone who is low to

moderate income. Those are the thresholds set forth by HUD. Those are the qualifiers. Councilmember McClain asked, once they receive the money, are there things that they have to keep up with? Ms. Calloway said, there is monthly reporting and that is in the contracts that are attached. They have to do monthly reporting. There is good news and bad news. The good news is that we got the program launched. The bad news is that we didn't launch it until November. So, our program year ends June 1, 2019 so they have six months to expend the funds. In the future, if this is something we do decide to continue, there will be a longer period and we will be able to get more results and metrics back from the program. These funds are authorized from January 1st to June 30th.

Chairman Joe Hafner asked, how many people turned in an application for this program? Ms. Calloway said, eleven applications were turned in. Some were ineligible. A lot of people don't know what sam.gov is. In order to get any federal funding, you do have to register on sam.gov. That was a barrier for some of the businesses. We recommended that each business work with the Small Business Technology Development Center at Arkansas State University. Moving forward next year, I would like to incorporate that into the program as well because they have a wealth of knowledge for small businesses.

Councilmember John Street said, this is good because it provides some assistance to start-up businesses or small businesses and it provides a low to moderate income person a job. Two of those are full-time jobs. Ms. Calloway said that is correct. One thing that we do a really good job of as a state is incentivizing factories and industries and that is great, but our bread and butter are our small businesses. We need to figure out a way to help them and keep them in our community.

Information Technology Director Jason Ratliff said, this is a small part of a bigger plan that we have. We would like to create what we would call a virtualized public safety environment. We are going to move twelve servers, non-critical servers into that cloud. That frees up some resources to virtualize the public safety servers that are actual physical servers. So, that should reduce the cost, the total ownership, and overhead on that part too. Chairman Joe Hafner said, the way I understand this is right now we pay a little short of \$4,000 per month for this service, but with this increased capacity and kind of off-site storage, we won't have future capital requirements for new servers and stuff like that. Like Jason said, it helps with the bigger plan of where IT is trying to move. Councilmember David McClain asked, would you care to explain that one more time, the virtualized public safety? Mr. Ratliff said virtualization is where you can take, say you have twelve servers, that is twelve physical servers that you have to buy, the procurement process, the overhead of keeping twelve servers up. You could buy two servers and make those really beefy and you could share those resources between those two servers to create virtual servers. That way if a server does go down, you

actually have two servers, so if one goes down, you have got even more redundancy. So, that helps. That is kind of what virtualization is for. Councilmember McClain said, ok.

Councilmember Dr. Charles Coleman asked, is the basement the best place to be for this, with all of the servers and stuff? Mr. Ratliff said, actually, those servers, that storage array, we are moving those servers to Ritter's cloud and we are taking that and putting that in Dispatch to be right there. The building space in the basement is nice, but the Dispatch building is rated for an F-4 tornado. It is rated a certain seismic level of earthquake. I forgot the level, but it is earthquake proof. Councilmember Coleman said, the reason why I asked that question about the servers is that for some reason, it has always bothered me that it was there and it should have been on the cloud or it should have been somewhere else. Mr. Ratliff said, Dispatch has the most-rated, best building for it per say. The downstairs, the basement, is pretty safe too.

Chairman Hafner said, just to be clear, Legistar will still be the official record or book of record, whatever you want to call it. But, sometimes, on Legistar, stuff is hard to find so I just wanted to make it easier for people who want to go out and look at the budget or look at the monthly financials or see who we are paying or look at audit reports, you know, stuff like that. You just go to the city website, the finance tab, and select what you want to see. Mr. Harvey said, this will give us a way to present, maybe a little bit easier way to navigate for somebody who is just looking for that information. Chairman Hafner said, right. I think this will be a pretty cost effective way of doing it. Like I said, Conway spent probably \$250,000-\$300,000 on their system. I think we will be able to do it pretty cost effective with pdf's and stuff like that. It will be a good first step I think.

Councilmember Ann Williams asked, do we need to have a reminder about the Nominating & Rules Committee meeting on Thursday? Chairman Hafner said, we have a working meeting at 5:00 p.m. in the fourth floor conference room. It is open to the public. Councilmember David McClain asked, is it about the rule changes again?
