**Subject:** Request at today's City Council meeting

Good Morning to all of you!

-We all know that in ONE vote at the council meeting later today that you can approve the 4 pulled items pulled from the Consent Agenda, that including the 2021 budget with or without any questions from the public.

-We ALSO know that you as City Council members, that were elected to represent the citizens of Jonesboro, would be able to table just Resolution 20:044, the proposed budget until the next City Council meeting on January 19. (Kinda like treating it as an Ordinance!). This would allow the Public to have more time to review how the City wants to spend our money.

State law says that you have until the end of January to pass the budget. So what's the hurry in passing it tonight?

IF you decide to table this one item, the proposed budget, this would start off the New Year knowing that you are helping Mayor Copenhaver meet his campaign goals of becoming MORE transparent and bringing our community back together again.

I hope you all consider tabling Resolution 20:044 until Tuesday, January 19, 2021.
