SUBJECT: FEDERAL CRIME LEGISLATION

At the conclusion of the Congressional-City Conference earlier this week President Clinton requested our help in the passage of a federal anti-crime bill. The Senate has passed its version of anti-crime legislation. The House Judiciary Committee is currently working on approximately 10 bills. The President is worried that without overwhelming public pressure, disagreements in the House and Senate will bog down and kill any final agreement in the Congress on anti-crime legislation. He, therefore, has asked for our help to prevent that from happening. Here is what we need you to do:

1. Get your council to adopt a resolution urging the Congress to pass anti-crime legislation without any further delay. Use the enclosed sample resolution as a guide.
