

R E S O L U T I O N

Whereas, the Mayor of the City of Jonesboro has expressed a desire to extend Bridge Street southeasterly across a portion of the American Legion property; and

Whereas, the members of The American Legion are desirous of aiding in every reasonable way the development and improvement of the City of Jonesboro; Now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Members of Pickett Post No. 21, The American Legion, Department of Arkansas, in regular business session assembled in Jonesboro, Arkansas, on the 25th day of May, 1964, that:

Section 1. Upon the conditions hereinafter stated Pickett Post No. 21 of The American Legion will dedicate to the public for its use as a street and public thoroughfare that area shown upon a Plat prepared by Fred Haywood & Associates (which Plat is attached hereto and made a part of this resolution) with corners indicated with red letters A, B, C, and D. The conditions are as follows:

- (a) A triangular area marked with the red letter B will be conveyed to Pickett Post No. 21 by its owners in exchange for a conveyance by Pickett Post No. 21 of another triangular area marked with the red letter P as an even exchange without additional consideration.
- (b) All other property owners now holding or owning land adjacent to the American Legion property on the East will also, without consideration of any kind, dedicate to the public for its use as a street such land as is needed and used in the proposed extension of Bridge Street as aforesaid. If any such owner or owners are compensated by the City of Jonesboro in any manner for such right-of-way then, in that event, the American Legion must also be reimbursed on the same basis or rate for its land.

Section 2. No work may begin upon land now owned by the American Legion until after this offer has been formally accepted by the Jonesboro City Council and by the adjacent owners as indicated in Section 1(b) in writing.
