Parks and Recreation Citizen Advisory Committee Procedures to Process Capital Improvement Recommendations by Citizens

- 1. Recommendations for capital improvements made by citizens are forwarded to the Parks and Recreation Citizen Advisory Committee by the Mayor, City Council or Parks Director.
- 2. Community member(s) making a capital improvement recommendation complete a form requesting to make a presentation to the Parks Citizen Advisory Committee providing information about the recommended project.
- 3. Presentations are made by community member(s) to the Parks Citizen Advisory Committee.
- 4. The Parks Citizen Advisory Committee determines the need and feasibility of the capital improvement and then votes to approve or not approve the facility recommendation.
 - a. Approval
 - i. Committee places the facility on the master plan.
- 5. By July 1st of each year the Citizen Advisory Committee shall update the master plan and forward the Master Plan to the Mayor and the Public Services Committee with a recommendation to place a certain item(s) from the Master Plan onto the Capital Improvement budget for the up-coming year.
 - a. Funding options for the capital improvement(s) may be recommended by the Parks Citizen Advisory Committee.
- 6. The Mayor reviews the master plan and specific capital improvement requests by the Parks Citizen Advisory Committee and approves, does not approve or makes recommended changes.
 - a. Approval: Forwards the recommended changes to the Public Services Committee.
 - b. Changes are sent back to the Parks Citizen Advisory Committee
- 7. Public Services Committee approves, does not approve or recommends changes to the master plan.
 - a. Approval: Public Services Committee forwards recommendation(s) to Finance Committee for consideration in the budget.
 - b. Changes: Public Services Committee sends recommendation(s) back to Advisory Committee for discussion and approval.
- 8. Finance Committee approves, does not approve or recommends changes to the capital improvement requests.
 - a. Approval places the recommended capital improvements onto the upcoming budget or onto a city wide capital improvement plan.
 - b. Changes would be sent back to the Public Services Committee and/or the Parks and Recreation Citizen Advisory Committee.
- 9. The full city council approves the annual budget and capital improvements for the year.
 - a. City council would also approve any additional funding sources needed to fund the project.
