



Overview


- Report discusses traffic volume trends on major roadways in the MPO area between 2003 and 2012
 - Jonesboro, Brookland, Bono, Bay and adjacent portions of Craighead County
 - All arterials and some collectors
 - Data collected by AHTD
- Examines national trend in vehicle miles traveled and compares local trend

Report Format

- Map of each route
- Historical AADT data for each counter
- Graphs to illustrate trends







Limitations

- Data
 - Short collection period
 - Adjustment process
 - Rounded values
- Use of Historical trends
 - Traffic is a complex process
 - Land use, demographics, economy, trip diversion, new infrastructure...
 - ...but, no traffic model for this area


Overview of Findings

- Significant increases in traffic volumes on several major roadways
 - Growth
 - Population
 - Development
 - Lack of alternatives
 - Routes
 - Modes

- Red Wolf Blvd
- US 63 (within urban area)
- Southwest Dr
- Johnson Ave (east of Red Wolf Blvd)
- Caraway Rd (south of US 63)
- Harrisburg Rd
- Old Greensboro Rd


Overview of Findings

- Significant decline in VMT nationally
 - Total VMT flat
 - Per capita VMT down




Overview of Findings

- Significant increase in VMT in Craighead County
 - Urban VMT up
 - Rural VMT down



Findings in Relation to Proposed Transportation Improvements

- Significant 10-year increases and high traffic volumes on Red Wolf Blvd and Johnson Ave
- High traffic volumes crossing RR track on Highland Dr



Findings in Relation to Proposed Transportation Improvements

- Significant 10-year increases in traffic volumes on US 63 Southwest Dr
- High traffic volumes at congested interchange area



Findings in Relation to Proposed Transportation Improvements

- Significant 10-year increases in traffic volumes on Caraway Road near US 63
- Roadway abruptly transitions from 5 lanes to 2 lanes
