Mr. Franken discussed the non-uniform pension plan. He explained they have evaluated the plan. It covers 292 people with a total liability of \$7.1 million. The current asset value is \$9.1 million due to an almost 11% return last year, which is higher than they expected. They do not anticipate any contributions to the plan. This could change due to life expectancy changes or if the plan doesn't perform as they expect. Councilman Dover questioned how many people are currently receiving benefits. Mr. Franken answered about 54 people are receiving benefits. The payments cost about \$300,000 per year. He added there are about 25 more individuals who qualify for retirement, but are still working.

APERMA Attorney Burt Newell discussed the lawsuit. He explained they were ordered into mediation on September 27th and arrived at a settlement. The settlement does not acknowledge any wrongdoing and is lower than the amount that was being asked for. He noted there is some risk with a trial, so they feel like this is a good business solution. Councilman Street stated he thinks this is a reasonable settlement. Councilman Moore also noted the price of the retention pond probably exceeds the amount being paid. He clarified that the settlement does not mean the City is acknowledging any wrongdoing. Mr. Newell answered that is true. The case will be dismissed with no acknowledgement of fault or wrongdoing and they do not anticipate any other litigation from this lawsuit. Councilman Moore then asked if City Attorney Phillip Crego is in agreement with the settlement. City Attorney Crego answered yes. Mr. Newell noted Mayor Perrin and City Attorney Crego were present at the mediation on September 27th.

Mayor Perrin reported on the following items:

The tower at the Services Center will be going up this week. The equipment is about 80% complete and some space will be rented out to other companies in order to generate some revenue.

In the morning, Engineering, Planning and Inspections will move into the Municipal Center. He thanked the Council for their support with the new Municipal Center. They are planning an open house on November 17th from 2-5 p.m. Once the move is

finished, they will provide the Council with a report detailing how much the move cost.

E-911, Police Department and Fire Department will have a training session at Valley View Schools on October 16th to discuss safety. He added the Fire Department also had lunch with some students at Westside Schools recently.

He attended a meeting of the Economic Development Committee with the Municipal League. Ms. Becky Thompson, director of AEDC, indicated the number one factor company's look at when they are considering a move to a city is energy. Energy is followed by quality of life, infrastructure, work force training, business retention and friendly business environment.

E-911 Director Jeff Presley just returned from Nixle training. He will be training other individuals in the community.

They held the Ward 3 meeting last night. The Ward 4 meeting will be held this Monday at the Nettleton fire station.

They have invited Union Pacific Railroad to visit the City.

The Downtown Jonesboro Association is now a member of the Main Street program. This will allow them to ask for professional help with grant writing. They will make a presentation at the next Council meeting.
