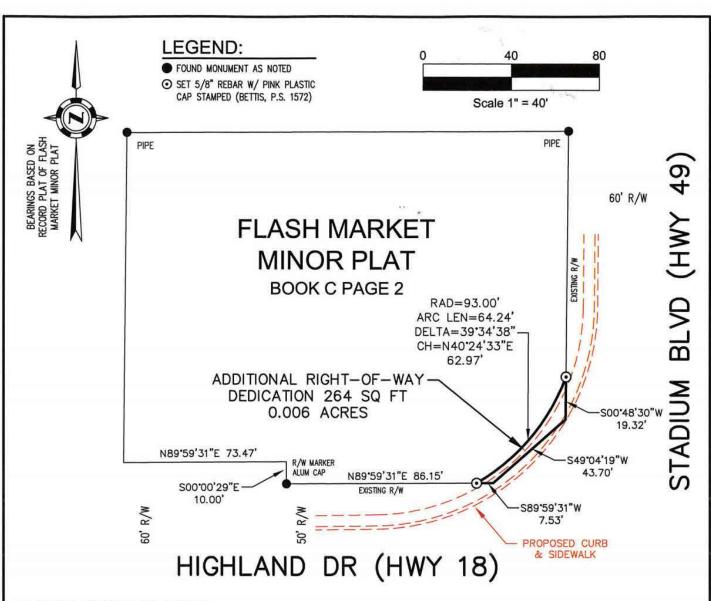

Ten sales in the immediate area were selected for comparison with subject. These sales range from June 2010 to May 2013 and from \$11.29/sf to \$20.00/sf. New restaurants as well as new retail centers have been built around the mall. Subject site is located on Highland Drive, directly across from the mall. More weight given Sales #1, 2, 9, and 10. All of these are located across from the mall. Sale #2 was a bank sale, so little weight given it. These four range from \$15.94-\$20.00/sf. The mean (average) of these four is \$17.89/sf. The mean (average) of all 10 sales is \$16.16/sf. Due to the smaller size of our subject (typically smaller sites sell for more per square foot than larger sites) as well as its location across from the mall, more weight given the upper end of the value range.

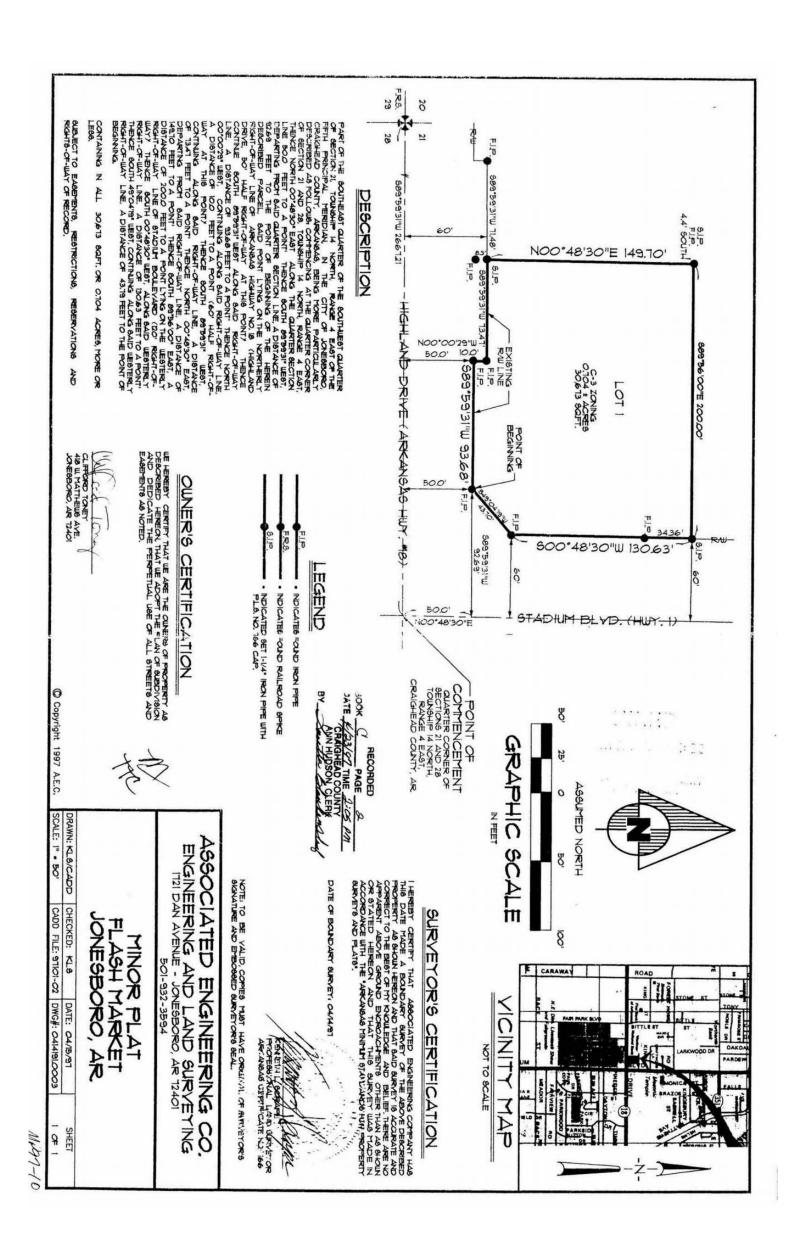

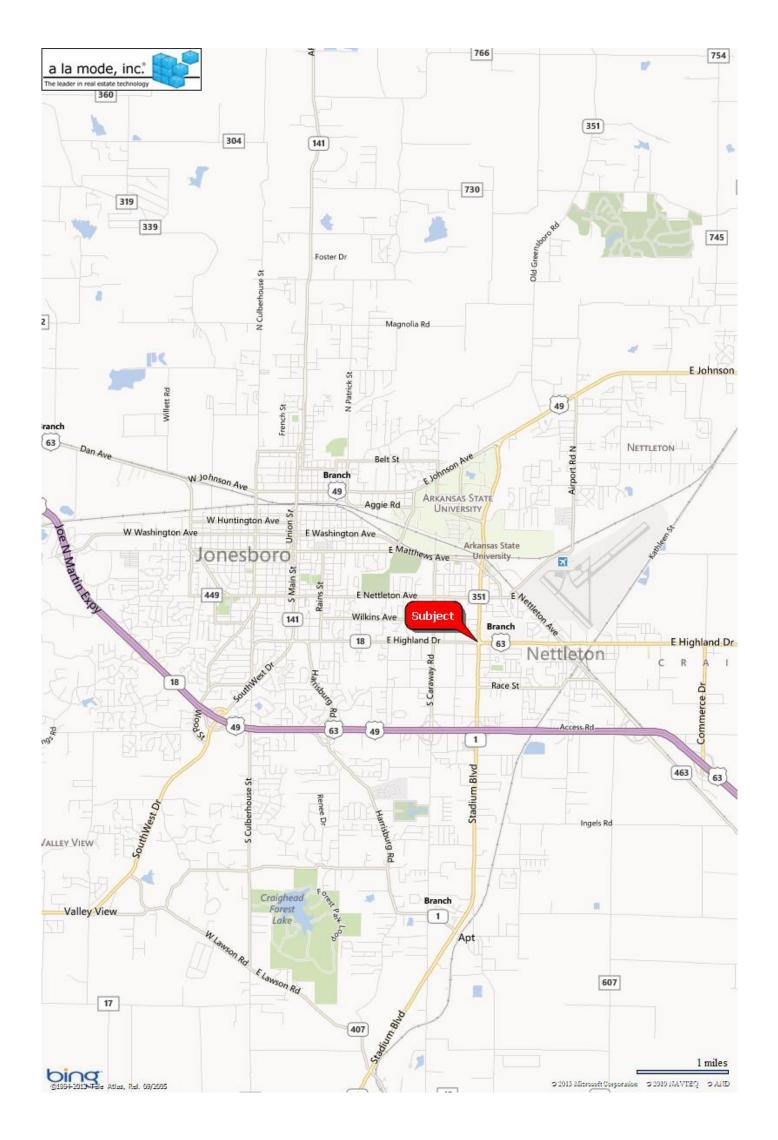

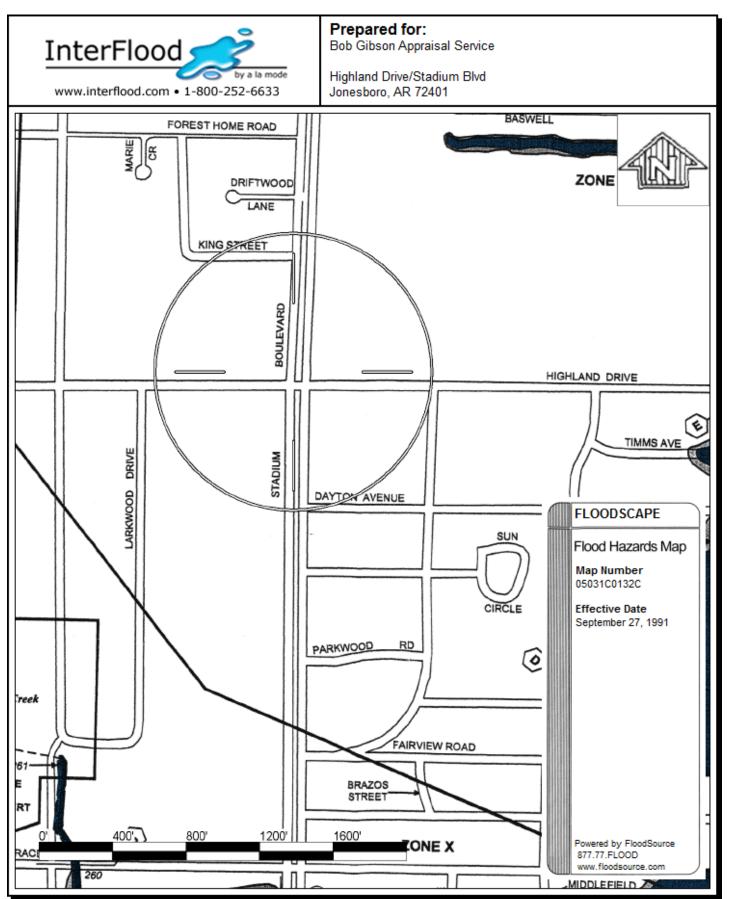






Flood Map
