Joint Meeting of Downtown Jonesboro Improvement Committee and Downtown

Merchants Association Meeting, August 19, 1997

AND

Downtown Jonesboro Improvement Committee Luncheon Meeting, August 21, 1997

The following is the combined minutes of the above referenced meetings. I apologize for the delay in getting these minutes to you - - things have been very busy for me during the past 30 days here at the bank, and I have been remiss in sending this information to you in a timely manner.

Please note we are scheduling our next luncheon meeting of the Downtown Jonesboro Improvement Committee for 12:00 noon on Thursday, October 9th, in the Board Room on the fourth floor of Union Planters Bank, 300 South Church. We hope each of you will be able to attend this important meeting. Please RSVP to Gaye Roach with your intentions on attending this luncheon meeting. Gaye's direct number at the bank is 933-2376.

*** Mayor Brodell announced he would be making a request to the City Council in the amount of \$75,000.00 for improvements to the sidewalks and street repair in the downtown area.

*** The Downtown Jonesboro Improvement Committee presented a letter to Mayor Brodell and the Jonesboro City Council requesting their attention to whatever ordinance and/or regulation that might be necessary to institute effective inspection of existing buildings and bringing up buildings in the downtown area to acceptable standards of safety and sanitation.

*** Gibson Sign Company is in the process of removing all the old downtown business district signage. They will be capping off those sign locations with a 2' X 4' square of concrete.

*** No response has been received to date from the Attorney General's Office regarding disbursement of funds held by the Downtown Improvement District.

*** It was announced by a member of the Downtown Merchants Association that Harris Furniture Store is planning a major expansion of their furniture store on Main Street.

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*** Questions were asked regarding the membership of the Downtown Merchants Association and ways we could obtain a new solicitation out to all downtown retail stores to become a participant in the Downtown Merchants Association. Several of the merchants present at this meeting stated they had not received an invitation to this meeting but took it upon themselves to attend to represent their retail establishment. It was discussed that it appears that no meetings of the Downtown Merchants Association have taken place in over two years - - and it appears for all practical purposes that this committee is defunct and not functioning. It was discussed that the committee feels it is impossible for us to have a downtown district meeting the expectations we are setting for our downtown area without a Downtown Merchants Association directing their efforts.

*** Jim Pitts discussed the downtown problem we are having with our trees being overgrown and unsightly in appearance. Williams Tree Service has agreed to perform a major pruning and reshape the trees in the downtown business district for a cost of \$2,300.00. The committee felt this was well worth the money to go forward with this service, with the City of Jonesboro and the Improvement District each paying half the cost of service.

*** City Water and Light has agreed to work with the Downtown Improvement District and the Downtown Jonesboro Improvement Committee to determine what appropriate lighting needs we should be considering for the downtown area to replace the signage that is being taken down. The City of Jonesboro has agreed to put up comparable lighting that is utilized throughout other areas of Jonesboro.

*** The preliminary estimate of cost for the research project was discussed at length by the group. MidWest Research Institute has presented a proposal which would have a projected estimated cost of \$20,300.00. This cost does not include task #5, which is a development of a reuse plan. The committee feels that this is the key part of the plan that is needed most by the Downtown Jonesboro Improvement Committee to determine what space would be most appropriately redesigned and used for the future betterment of the downtown area. Without this task being completed, we feel the project would be incomplete. Its anticipated the cost of this task could be equal to, if not greater, that the original cost, which makes the survey expense extremely high. Further discussion will be made at the next meeting concerning this project.

*** April from D'Arcy Interiors suggested the City of Jonesboro and the Downtown Merchants Associations look at ways to improve signage locations directing traffic to the downtown district. She stated that from the Highway 63 Bypass there is very little signage available for this purpose. This is a concern of the committee and the Mayor offered his assistance in looking into proper signage in directing traffic to the downtown area.

There being no further business, this meeting was adjourned.

Mayor Hubert Brodell and Jonesboro City Council

Ladies and Gentlemen:

A number of interested businessmen/women and property owners have joined together to begin the process of developing approaches to the improvement of Jonesboro's downtown area. All the evidence we have gathered indicates that a downtown with vitality is still a necessary and desirable part of the future of any community.

We know that there must be a cooperative and coordinated effort of all persons interested in civic improvement for there to be the kind of effort that will cause us to once again be proud of our downtown area. One of these efforts, we believe, should be along the lines of ensuring that existing structures are safe and sanitary. Some definitely are not at the present time.

It is the purpose of this letter to encourage you, the City Council, who represent the most important part of any effort, to move forward, to research and put in place whatever kinds of ordinances and regulations that may be necessary to institute effective inspection of existing buildings on some recurring basis to ensure that these buildings are maintained, or, perhaps more importantly, are brought up to a standard of safety and sanitation that will reduce the risk of damage and destruction in this closely connected commercial area. This might involve, among other things, establishing a system of electrical inspections or a more complete system of structural inspection on the part of city representatives.

We are not certain what is needed in this regard, therefore, we have no package of documents to submit to you for your consideration. We would be glad to work with anyone you designate to study and produce these results.

Since our research leads us to believe that there are substandard structures in the downtown area, we would hope that this process could begin as quickly as possible.
