"CONSTITUTION WEEK"

SEPTEMBER 17-23, 1990

WHEREAS, Our Founding Fathers, in order to secure the blessings of liberty for themselves and their posterity, did ordain and establish a Constitution for the United States of America, and

WHEREAS, It is of the greatest importance that all citizens fully understand the provisions and principles contained in the Constitution in order to support it, preserve it and defend it against encroachments, and

WHEREAS, The Two hundred third anniversary of the signing of the Constitution provides a historic opportunity for all Americans to learn about and recall achievements of our Founders, and to reflect on the rights and privileges of citizenship, as well as its attendants responsibilities, and,

WHEREAS, The independence guaranteed to the American people by the Constitution should be celebrated by appropriate ceremonies and activities during Constitution Week, September 17 through 23, as designated by proclamation of the President of the United States of America in accordance with Public Law 915.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Hubert Brodell, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Jonesboro do hereby proclaim the week of September 17 through 23 as Constitution Week, in the City of Jonesboro and join Jonesboro Chapter Daughters of the American Revolution in urging all our citizens to pay special attention during that week to our Federal Constitution and the advantage of American Citizenship.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of the City of Jonesboro to be affixed at Jonesboro this day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and ninety and the Independence of the United States of America, the two hundred thirteenth.
