Dear Mr. Timms:

I am writing you in regards to the development on West Nettleton Extended known as Manor Heights Subdivision. H & S Construction Company has completed the fence as required but they have not completed the rest of the items that were agreed upon by the City Council.

The items that have not been fully completed yet are (1) establishment of an earthen swale and berm, (2) sod on sloped area that is alive and growing, (3) finally, eight (8) large pine trees on sloped area that are alive and growing.

Waiting this late in the year to place sod and plant the trees has lessened the chances of their survival unless daily watering and care is taken to prevent their dying. The agreement between the City Council and H & S Construction Company was for the items to be alive and growing and the bond was written such to guarantee this.
