6. OTHER BUSINESS

Councilmember Janice Porter said, Mr. Chairman, in responding to a citizens query I engaged in dialogue with the chief, and he has prepared some remarks concerning our Entertainment District. Police Department Chief Rick Elliot approached the podium and said, thank you Mr. Chair. Yes, briefly this afternoon Councilmember Porter and I had a discussion about the Entertainment District, and we're at that one-year mark since we started the Entertainment District. And I'm going to bring up some numbers on what reflects the, as far as policing in that area, during this one-year threshold. I did not go back and get several years of study prior to this, do to the late afternoon, I didn't get a chance to get those numbers pulled. But overall, during from last August to September this year, police received 965 calls for service in the Entertainment District area. Now that could be a traffic stop, it could be a pedestrian issue, it could be a dog, anything for any reason that somebody calls the police department for. Whatever reason that goes under this tick mark of 965. From that number there was 146 criminal reports made from that list of calls. And these were where somebody was arrested or some kind of report was made due to a criminal activity. Out of that criminal activity of 146 reported, 18 of those were alcohol related, it could be a DWI or public intoxication. And then, 30 of those were drug related. So people and drug issues a little bit bigger than the alcohol issues down there. So, again, I know there's not much to compare to previous years. Just in general conversation, I don't really see it there's a whole lot of big upticks in numbers as we're looking at across the board. I think overall our DWIs seem to be down. I think people are getting wiser about using Ubers and the cabs, and so I commend the community for doing better on that aspect of drinking and being responsible. But again, here we are at that year threshold mark for the Entertainment District and just wanted to kind of lay some things out there and see if anybody has any questions. If you'd like further analysis then we can certainly get that and send that out.

Councilmember David McClain said, if I may. So you said that's inside the boundaries of the district. That doesn't necessarily mean it was downtown walking around, it's

inside the boundaries. Chief Rick Elliot said, it's whatever we've defined as the Entertainment District and using that geofencing, I had the analyst pull the calls related to that area. So, it could be a traffic stop, it could be anything. And it's all broke down to every call and I can send you this if you want to look through the data. But most of that is non-criminal related, a lot of it's traffic. It could be somebody homeless standing on the corner somebody wants a welfare check on or whatever, that is a call for service. So, what that call for service is, it varies across the whole board of whatever, but when you break down the second sheet there was 146 calls that generated into something criminal.

Councilmember Janice Porter said, has the park ranger program been in effect long enough to have an impact? Chief Rick Elliot said, we're seeing a relief on having to send officers to certain calls, especially downtown or at the parks. Sometimes we get calls of just welfare concern, welfare check, and so the rangers are able to help us out on that call and fills those calls for us. So, we're starting to get some relief in that respect, yes. So, the rangers had to go through a training phase and now they're out on their own starting to do their thing they're getting more in tune of what's going on, and so yes the benefits starting to pay off.

Chairman Brian Emison said, good information. Thank you chief.

VECTOR MOSQUITO CONTROL REPORT FOR AUGUST 2025

Chairman Brian Emison said, I will say in reviewing this I did have a question. I'm going to submit this over to Vector. I was reviewing this over the weekend. I noticed we had more total mosquitoes collected from year to year, about 550. But what was different was, the total average mosquitoes collected jumped from 7.3 to 73 per day. So, I feel like we missed a decimal point on that but just as a point of clarification I'm going to send that back over to Vector. But from year over year, in 2024 we also had 12 total inspected sites compared to having 60 this year, So I know that we're seeing quite a significant jump in the total sights inspected so I feel like that number should be down or maybe they just didn't check those traps as frequent. Maybe something's changed on that point. But I did notice that the total sprayed miles have remained about the same. There's about 41 more, approximately, there from year over year, but I did notice a considerable uptick in our aerial sprays. We had five this past month compared to two the previous year, encompassing a difference of about 40,000 square acres that was covered in the previous month. But just a couple of points I think we need to clarify with Vector as we continue to go forward with them. Especially with the discrepancy between the total trap per day number going from 7.3 up to 73 mosquitoes. I feel like that warrants a little bit of a broader conversation.

Councilmember David McClain said, that made me think of this. I guess, next year... they're up this year, is their contract up this year? Chairman Brian Emison said, I believe so. Councilmember David McClain said, I'd love to hear what they plan to do differently going forward. I know we've seen some dry times, and I know it's even dry right now, so things aren't really equal to a wet season, but I really would like to see what they're going to do differently next year as compared to this year. And hopefully they'll give us a different answer than we'll just add more spraying or maybe some controlled or some focused areas and using some different techniques. I'd love for them to give us a presentation on that.

Councilmember LJ Bryant said, Mr. Chairman, I'm just a broken record. I mean, they

do business in nine states. I just think they could do a better job making a presentation, and maybe as Councilman McClain said, with them being up for bid maybe they'll be more interested. But I mean, the two Harvard MBA's that own the company, maybe they could at least zoom in and talk to us a little bit and have a real conversation. And doing business in nine states they should have some metrics for us to measure ourselves against. Because when you read the data, I have no idea what any of it means. And I understand it's very difficult to compare, I mean, they're doing work in Mississippi and Louisiana and Colorado and all these places, and topography and weather, and there's so many different variables but surely they can educate us a little bit so we know what we're up against and how are we really doing. Because I don't think anybody up here, I mean, how do you even know what that report means. Chairman Brian Emison said, sure. Right. I know one of the things, when I looked at their website not too long ago, is that they did talk about data reporting and some of the things that they had outlined on the data reporting segmentation, it didn't seem to be reflected in these reports. Just from the way I look at the titling and the way that I interpreted as well, but I think that's something that we focus heavily on whenever we do file an RFP for coming up for future bids to give us some sample reporting and give us the capability to go through it and make sure it's the information that we want to see on a ongoing basis.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 6 - ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES TO COMPLY WITH CHANGES TO THE ARKANSAS LAW REGARDING PRIVATE CLUB PERMITS

WHEREAS, the City of Jonesboro has need to amend our ordinances to be consistent with changes to Arkansas law passed in the most recent legislative session; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Jonesboro, Arkansas desires to make the included changes.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JONESBORO, ARKANSAS:

That the definition of private club in Article I, Section 6-1 shall be deleted and replaced with the following definition:

Private club means a non-profit corporation, sole-proprietorship, corporation, partnership, or limited liability company organized and existing or authorized to do business under the laws of this state.

They will return the Arkansas background check results to you; ***the original document must accompany the City of Jonesboro application.*** If this report indicates you (partner, stockholder or member of LLC, if applicable) are not a convicted felon, your application will be eligible for consideration by the city. Amount of \$25.00 (check or money order) is due at time of submission to Arkansas State Police.

- Provide a written report of findings to the City.

Section 3: The City hereby adopts the creation of third-party inspection requirements for passive fire protection based on building occupancy type.

AN ORDINANCE TO ADD SECTION 2-289 TO THE JONESBORO CODE OF ORDINANCES TITLED FIREFIGHTER BILL OF RIGHTS

WHEREAS, the Arkansas General Assembly adopted Act 686 of 2025, which recommends a basic bill of rights for firefighters of municipalities in Arkansas; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jonesboro endorses a firefighter Bill of Rights for firefighters who provide critical safety services for Jonesboro residents, and visitors; and

WHEREAS, the protective measures outlined in the Bill of Rights provide for clear and consistent guidance on how corrective and disciplinary actions are handled; and

WHEREAS, the Act authorizes the City to adopt a local ordinance establishing any or all of the procedures under the Act as a guide for negotiating personnel issues with firefighters.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL for the City of Jonesboro, Arkansas, that:

The City Council of the City of Jonesboro, Arkansas hereby enacts Section 2-289 to be titled Firefighter Bill of Rights as shown in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein as if set out word for word.

EXHIBIT A

Sec. 2-289 – Firefighter Bill of Rights

- (A) **Purpose.** The purpose of this ordinance is to formally establish a firefighter bill of rights. The bill of rights provides basic protections for the firefighters regarding personnel disciplinary and promotional actions.
- (B) **Definitions.** As used in this ordinance:
- (1) *Firefighter* means a public servant vested by law with the primary duty of fighting fires and providing fire protection services to a municipality.
 - (2) *Formal proceeding* means a proceeding heard before any officer, committee, or other body of municipal government with the authority to take disciplinary action against a firefighter.
 - (3) *Official departmental charges* means a written document from the fire chief or other lawful authority notifying the accused firefighter that charges of misconduct have been made and setting forth the specifics of the alleged misconduct.
 - (4) *Pre-disciplinary hearing* is a brief, formal meeting where the firefighter has an opportunity to respond to proposed disciplinary action before it is finalized.
- (C) **Disciplinary proceedings.** When a firefighter is under investigation for alleged improper conduct with a possible result of termination, demotion, or other disciplinary action causing loss of pay or status, the following minimum standards may apply:
- (1) Adverse inference shall not be drawn, and no punitive action shall be taken from a refusal of the firefighter being investigated to participate in the investigation or be interrogated other than when the firefighter is on duty or is otherwise fully compensated for the time spent in accordance with municipal and departmental overtime policy, state law, and federal law.
 - (2) An interrogation of a firefighter shall take place at:
 - (a) The office of those conducting the investigation;
 - (b) The place where the firefighter reports for duty; or
 - (c) Another reasonable place as the investigator may determine.
 - (3) The firefighter being investigated shall be informed at the commencement of his or her interrogation of:
 - (a) The nature of the investigation;
 - (b) The identity and authority of the person or persons conducting the investigation; and
 - (c) The identity of all persons present during the interrogation.
 - (4) During the interrogation of the firefighter, questions will be posed by or through only one (1) interrogator at a time.

- (5) An interrogation of a firefighter in connection with an investigation shall be for a reasonable period of time and shall allow for reasonable periods for the rest and personal necessities of the firefighter.
- (6) No threat, harassment, promise, or reward shall be made to a firefighter in connection with an investigation in order to induce the answering of any questions that the firefighter has a legal right to refrain from answering, but immunity from prosecution may be offered to induce such a response.
- (7) Interrogations
 - (a) An interrogation of a firefighter in connection with an investigation against him or her shall be recorded in full.
 - (b) The firefighter may make his or her own independent recording of the interrogation and have one (1) witness of his or her choosing present who shall be:
 - (i) An attorney; or
 - (ii) A member of the fire department who is not related in any way to the matter under investigation.
- (8) A formal proceeding with the authority to administer disciplinary action against a firefighter shall not be held unless official departmental charges are brought.
- (9) Notice of charges.
 - (a) Official departmental charges shall contain the following:
 - (i) Specific conduct that is alleged to be improper;
 - (ii) Date and the approximate time of the alleged misconduct;
 - (iii) Witnesses whose information provided the basis for the charges; and
 - (iv) Specific rules, regulations, orders, or laws alleged to have been violated.
 - (b) If additional potential violations or witnesses emerge during the investigation, a supplemental notice of charges shall be issued to the firefighter as soon as practicable.
- (10) Pre-disciplinary hearings
 - (a) A firefighter under official departmental charges is entitled to a pre-disciplinary hearing before the fire chief, if a disciplinary action is being considered.
 - (b) The firefighter may have one (1) witness of his or her choosing present at the hearing; the witness shall be:
 - (i) An attorney; or
 - (ii) A member of the fire department who is not related in any way to the matter under investigation.
 - (c) The pre-disciplinary hearing occurs following the conclusion of the investigation
 - (i) The department makes a tentative disciplinary recommendation.

- (ii) The firefighter receives notice and attends the pre-disciplinary hearing.
- (d) The pre-disciplinary hearing provides an opportunity to:
 - (i) Notify the employee of proposed discipline.
 - (ii) Outline the circumstances or findings that support disciplinary action.
 - (iii) Allow the firefighter to explain, present mitigating facts, or dispute the findings.
- (e) After the pre-disciplinary hearing, the department finalizes its decision and administers the disciplinary action.
- (f) Notification of personnel action. Except under exigent circumstances, a firefighter shall be notified of the pending action by written official departmental charges a reasonable time before the action is taken when a personnel action may result in a loss of:
 - (i) Pay;
 - (ii) Benefits; or
 - (iii) Status.
- (11) A formal proceeding under which a firefighter may be penalized shall not be brought except upon charges signed by the person making those charges.
- (12) Appeals of qualifying personnel actions shall be conducted pursuant to Chapter 10 of the Civil Service Commission Manual.
- (D) **Disclosure not required for promotion or assignment.** A firefighter shall not be required to disclose any of the following information as it relates to the firefighter or a member of the firefighter's household for the purpose of promotion or assignment.
 - (1) An item of his or her property;
 - (2) Income;
 - (3) Assets;
 - (4) Debts; or
 - (5) Expenditures.
- (E) **Participation in political activities.** Except when on duty or acting in his or her official capacity, a firefighter of a municipality shall not be:
 - (1) Prohibited from engaging in political activity; or
 - (2) Denied the right to refrain from engaging in political activity.
- (F) **No retaliation for exercise of rights;** Other legal remedies.
 - (1) A firefighter shall not be penalized or threatened with a penalty for exercising his or her rights under this subchapter.
 - (2) This subchapter is not an exclusive legal remedy for a firefighter with respect to any rights a firefighter has under this subchapter.
 - (3) Retaliation against an employee who, in good faith, reports a concern, participates in an investigation, or cooperated in any inquiry or proceedings is strictly prohibited.

September / October 2025

Vector Disease Control, Inc. (VDCI) provides a proven, scientific approach to mosquito control for the City of Jonesboro. VDCI's operations include larval and adult mosquito surveillance followed by the application of larvicides and adulticides.

Mosquito Surveillance

VDCI has utilized a total of **(13)** New Jersey light traps placed in residential and recreational areas throughout Jonesboro. These traps collected an average of **48.0** mosquitoes per trap per night (**1248**) total mosquitoes during this time. There have been a total of **3** mosquito species collected.

Larval Control Activity

Permanent water, flood water, artificial containers, and drainage system sites are inspected for larval mosquito breeding on a regular basis. In total, **13** sites were inspected with **5** sites having mosquito larvae present. As a result of these inspections, **280** ounces of granular BTI (VectoBacG) was applied to these mosquito breeding sites. Additionally, VDCI is continuing to eliminate breeding habitat for artificial container mosquitoes by targeting bird baths, buckets, tires etc.

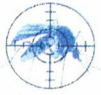

In response to community events and mosquito surveillance data, VDCI applied the adulticide on **35** truck routes for this reporting period. All adulticide ULV applications were made with truck-mounted ULV units equipped with GPS-enabled monitors. During this report period, a total of **1,321.60** spray miles and **48,051.50 acres** were treated with a total of **342** gallons of adulticide in residential and recreational areas. In addition to routine truck spraying, VDCI has responded to **5** service requests and adulticided all parks, and any special events during the month.

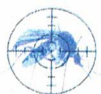
Summary

Throughout this reporting period, VDCI has continued to provide exceptional control of larval and adult mosquito populations. VDCI will remain diligent in our surveillance and control activities to prevent a significant increase in the mosquito population.
