6. OTHER BUSINESS

Councilmember David McClain said, I've got a quick question, so, especially with the liens. Are we seeing repeat offenders, and if so, are we charging them differently, or no? City Attorney Carol Duncan said, it's based off of the work that gets done on the

property. Chairman Joe Hafner said, their fees just accumulate. Some of them have been paying and some of them have not been paying. Councilmember Dr. Anthony Coleman said, just to follow up with that. So, basically what you're saying is if I have a \$275 lien, I pay it and then do something else you just charge me another \$275? City Attorney Carol Duncan said, what ever it cost. The liens are based upon recouping what the city spends in fixing the problem. So, if it's a mowing lien it's based on what it cost us. Now, we have some administrative costs that goes in there. Whatever it cost to file it at the courthouse and things like that but it's not a money maker. It's a way to break even. We're not allowed to increase. It's not like a court fine. I guess that's the best way to look at it. You know, with a court fine a second offense may cost more, a third offense might cost more. And it's not that this type of lien is strictly just to recoup the money the city has to spend to maintain the property you should be maintaining. Councilmember Dr. Anthony Coleman said, I know we're pretty good about charging. City Attorney Carol Duncan said, right. Councilmember Dr. Anthony Coleman said, but are they good about... City Attorney Carol Duncan said, sometimes. What's happened with the tax collector is they have addressed the statute that says you're not allowed to pay your taxes unless you take care of these types of liens, so we find, especially on the smaller ones, that we're getting more payments on them then we use to, because of the position taken by the tax collector that says you need to satisfy this lien with the city before you can pay your taxes. Because they don't want to lose the property all together. Now, some people don't live here, you know, they've inherited the property from a grandparent, those no, they don't care if the property goes because of lack of taxes. But those that don't want to lose their property, when they go to pay their taxes tend to pay the lien. Councilmember Dr. Anthony Coleman said, thank you. I have another question not pertaining to this.

Councilmember Dr. Anthony Coleman said, I see Brian here. When is the mayor going to submit his new plan. The reason I'm asking is because I know we're supposed to try to appropriate a lot of these ARPA funds and others, and I'm just, I've been asking so, but nobody's been answering. Chief Administrative Officer Brian Richardson approached the podium and said, yeah, as part of the, from the last time it was introduced and there were some questions about some additional information that was requested by this committee. We authorized a couple of different studies. One being a facility study. We did some follow-up on the parks plan since it's been adopted. It helps lay out some specific expenses. We're working right now with the Community Development Department and with Engineering to put together a comprehensive presentation to provide to Finance that kind of details each expenditure. We looked at, possibly later this month at the next Finance meeting, moving with a authorizing resolution. It's not binding, as far as if the package is passed or not, but it just allows the city to recoup any kind of investment or fees in studying the process dated back to whenever the resolution would have passed. So, that would be the first step for revenue bond. We're looking at probably next month. Because, a lot of cities will introduce that, because let's say you start incurring a lot of expenses prior to when that actual revenue bond becomes active, it allows you to charge that back to the revenue bond. So, if you start designing plans or anything like that prior to actual cash in hand revenue bond it allows you to recoup back to a certain date. So that's kind of step one. Councilmember Dr. Anthony Coleman said, I guess I'm just not equating that with what I'm asking with the ARPA funding because that's just an appropriation. Chief Administrative Officer Brian Richardson said, well yes, the ARPA funding would just require an appropriation, but it's part of a larger capital improvement plan. ARPA funding is obviously separate. Councilmember Dr. Anthony Coleman said, I got you. Great. I got it now. It makes sense now.

A RESOLUTION BY THE CITY OF JONESBORO, ARKANSAS TO AMEND THE FY2024 BUDGET AND APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR ADDITIONAL STREET OVERLAYS AND AMEND THE CONTRACT WITH ATLAS ASPHALT, INC. THE 2024 ASPHALT MILLING AND OVERLAYS FOR SELECTED CITY STREET PROJECTS

WHEREAS, Atlas Asphalt is nearing completion of the current \$1,000,000 overlay contract and believe an addition to the scope could be fulfilled in 2024, allowing for additional infrastructure investments to be considered; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jonesboro Street and Engineering Departments have identified multiple projects based off data provided by recently incorporated pavement management software; and

WHEREAS, Atlas Asphalt, Inc. has agreed to amend the 2024 Asphalt Milling and Overlays Selected City Street Project to include additional City streets; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jonesboro desires to amend the FY2024 budget to appropriate an additional \$1,500,000 in Capital Improvement Funds for street overlays.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF JONESBORO, ARKANSAS THAT:

Section 1: The FY2024 Budget / Capital Improvement Fund is amended to fund an additional \$1,500,000 appropriation for street overlays.

Section 2: The City of Jonesboro shall amend the contract with Atlas Asphalt, Inc. to perform overlays for additional City streets.

Section 3: The Mayor, Harold Copenhaver, and City Clerk April Leggett, are hereby authorized by the City Council for the City of Jonesboro to execute all documents necessary to allocate funds and amend the contract with Atlas Asphalt, Inc.
