


On 8-25-2008, I, ACO, Jeff McGinnis received a call from 911 dispatch, to 806 Olive, in reference to a dog in distress. Upon arrival, I found 2 male dogs on the back deck entangled severely. A Golden Retriever had entangled his cable around a male Husky. The cable was rapped around the left hind leg, around the middle section and around the neck area of the Husky. When the Retriever jumped off the deck, it would tighten the cable around the Husky. The Husky was not able to move at all, but was trying to bite at the Retriever, when he jumped up and down off of the deck. I decided to dart both dogs, so that I could un-tangle the dogs without being bitten. I had to take the cable off of the Retriever, in order to get the 2 dogs apart. After getting the two dogs apart, I had to leave them off of the cables, because the cables were so tangled up. I gave the dogs what water I could find and left them to rest. I left a door hanger on the front door for the owners to contact me. Had I not been dispatched out to this call, the Husky would have died. I then called my Asst. Supervisor and explained everything to him and cleared the scene.
