




Initiative	Description

Community-Based Planning	Economic Development Strategic Plans for counties and larger communities
Transportation Planning	Transportation planning focused on the mobility of the traditionally marginalized
Housing Planning	Regional analysis of existing housing stock and provision of specific recommendations
