Valley View Agri-Systems & Valley View Bearing & Supply

I am very fortunate to have had the opportunity to assume many different roles during my tenure at Valley View Agri-Systems and Valley View Bearing & Supply. This has allowed me to gain a very broad working knowledge of the business and its operations. I began as a design engineer, but gained several advertising, branding, and technical service responsibilities early on. I was also given the opportunity to manage the IT department through a transition period which included a complete infrastructure revamp project and multiple personnel and building additions.

As I continued to grow in the company, it was determined that I would best benefit the company by focusing my efforts in the areas of human resources and branding. I have been largely responsible for establishing the company's brand image and standards, along with the company's day to day advertising, promotion, and trade show activities. This area of responsibility also allows me to

plan and execute many of the company's community outreach, hospitality, and customer appreciation events.

In July of 2017, I assumed the role of HR Manager for Valley View Agri-Systems and Valley View Bearing & Supply. I have enjoyed the challenge of learning a new field and leveraging my ability to connect with people through this position. Since assuming this role, our company has seen a great deal of change in personnel levels, benefits packages, and company culture. I have had the unique opportunity to help the company through a period of market correction and the shaping of a culture centered on rallying around a great team and pushing through a depressed agriculture market. We are a much healthier company because of the changes we have made.

I have also been a key element in our technical service department since the harvest season of 2010. I began assisting my supervisor on technical service calls in 2010 and was given the opportunity to lead that division the following year. I was responsible for performing start-ups, customer training, and service of complex grain drying machinery until the 2016 harvest season. This required a working knowledge of grain drying machines and grain drying theory. I was also responsible for communicating with customers, during the most intense season of the year, in a manner that allowed them to understand the machine, how to properly operate it, and produce the desired grain quality at the end of the process. I now provide support for this operation as needed.

NEA Speedway

I assumed the role of managing partner of NEA Speedway, LLC upon its inception after purchasing the former Poinsett County Speedway in 2009, along with 2 partners. We operated the facility each racing season from 2009 through 2014. During this time I was responsible for promoting the facility and its events, staffing the facility and managing all personnel, directing the race program each event night, managing concession stand operations, configuring the rules of competition, enforcing those rules, and all bookkeeping operations of the business. The decision to cease operations and seek a buyer or lessee was made after the 2014 race season. I was responsible for structuring a lease agreement, which covered the 2015 and 2016 season. We sold the facility in early March, 2017.

While at Cavenaugh Ford-Lincoln, I worked my way around the dealership from automobile and parts sales to business division management. While in the Customs Manager role, I worked in conjunction with all areas of the dealership, including sales, finance, parts, service, and the body shop. It was my responsibility to coordinate with each department by aiding in accessories sales, scheduling and overseeing vehicle builds, maintaining inventories, and designing and maintaining a retail space inside the showroom. While working as Online Sales Manager, my main responsibilities were to maintain the dealership's websites and serve the online customer by answering their product information requests, setting appointments, executing vehicle sales, and nurturing long-term relationships through the service department. I was also responsible for many customer servicecentered duties in the dealership's Business Development Center.



- * Agency heads, department directors, and division directors of state government shall file the Statement of Financial Interest within thirty (30) days of appointment or employment unless already filed by January 31.
- * Appointees to state boards or commissions shall file the Statement of Financial Interest within thirty (30) days after appointment unless already filed by January 31.
- * If a person is included in any category listed above for any part of a calendar year, that person shall file a Statement of Financial Interest covering that period of time regardless of whether they have left their office or position as of the date the statement is due.
