Placing the Fairgrounds this close to the growing area of Jonesboro, Paragould, and Brookland would only halt the connection of these cities. I have heard the Fair-board make references to the Fairgrounds connecting Jonesboro to Paragould. As I have once said, people will connect the two towns, not commerce and certainly not a District Fairgrounds. Like other residents that oppose this action know what the fair will bring: noise, lights, odor, crime, traffic, and low property values. The area between Jonesboro and Paragould has the potential to become a beautiful and properous suburb of Jonesboro. All those that wish to relocate out of run-down and dangerous residental communities in Jonesboro (like the residential area near the current Fairgrounds site) will stop looking for land and homes in this direction due to its proximity to the proposed Fairgrounds site. I have yet to talk to an individual that would be interested in living where I reside currently. The comments I receive are more like: "I will pray for you and your family that the city council makes the right decision and stops the Fair from building there." And to those that live among me that state that they welcome the Fair; well that statment is not entirely true. They do not welcome the Fair, but the opportunity to hook up to city sewer to avoid large out of pocket expenses to repair their own faulty systems. I have been utterly consumed with this matter and I fear that your minds are made up. Please do not force me to worry that each time my son goes outside to play that someone will hurt him. Please do not force me to lose any more sleep over something you have control over. You are the ones that speak for me when I do not have the strength or knowhow to stand on my own. Now is the time to speak up and make one decision that will certainly have the most impact on the residents of Jonesboro--not just the ones that will live near the proposed Fair-grounds, but all residents of Jonesboro, Brookland, and Paragould that stand to lose from this action as well. I ask you to listen to your heart and not the others around you that tempt you with incorrect information and threats of inappropriate building choices-such as "We will build in the county without your support." Now is the time to stop those that see you as "no obstacle." You are the ones we trust to keep our children safe. You are the ones we look to to protect our homes.
