Police Chief Michael Yates explained the Police Department had participated in a strength and conditioning program with St. Bernards for the Swat Team. He added he has been unable to find another place to do this kind of training.

Mr. Paul Pickens with St. Bernards discussed the results from the Swat Team members who participated in the program.

Mayor Perrin asked if the \$70 enrollment fee is in addition to the Assessment Screening fee. Mr. Pickens answered yes. He added St. Bernards Health & Wellness is doing an exclusive program just for the Police Department and the amount would be \$95 a month per officer.

Councilman Moore stated the City may pay more upfront, but it could be a benefit to the City when it came to workers compensation claims. Chief Yates noted he would not expect 100% compliance with the Police Department, but he could phase the program in over time and if the City would help offset some of the cost he thinks most of the Police Department would be willing to pay the difference. Councilman Moore recommended that the City require a post employee physical evaluation because someone could pass the physical test when they were first hired, but currently not be in shape for the job.

Discussion was held concerning what the statistics are on various health issues.

Mr. Pickens stated that he has had several officers who have rotated off of the SWAT Team ask if they could rejoin this program because it was so beneficial.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCES RELATING TO TAXI CAB SERVICES OPERATING IN THE CITY OF JONESBORO

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Jonesboro, Arkansas desires to ensure that all taxicabs operating in the City of Jonesboro are in safe operating condition, and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 42-77(b), Ordinance 42-78, and Ordinance 42-82 contain language regarding state inspections which is obsolete and needs to be amended.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JONESBORO, ARKANSAS:

SECTION ONE: That Ordinance 42-77(b) shall be deleted and replaced with the following language:

"No operator shall operate and no driver shall drive a taxicab which is in an unsanitary condition or is mechanically unsafe. The Mayor, or his designated agent, is hereby authorized to order any operator and/or driver to immediately discontinue the use of any vehicle as a taxicab until specific, designated unsanitary conditions have been remedied and/or until such vehicle is in sufficient mechanical condition to be successfully reinspected. In the event the Police Chief is designated by the Mayor in this capacity, the Police Chief may delegate to any certified police officer the ability to immediately withdraw an operator's license until reinspection occurs. The provisions of this section shall be in addition to any other penalty or remedy provided for in this article."

SECTION TWO: That Ordinance 42-78 shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following language:

"It shall be unlawful for any person to operate any taxicab in the City of Jonesboro unless it has a valid inspection issued by the Jonesboro Police Department certifying that the taxicab has been duly inspected and that it is in safe operating condition and that all of the required equipment is in good repair. Said inspections

shall be done annually on each taxicab in operation."

SECTION THREE: That Ordinance 42-82(c) shall be amended as follows:

In the first sentence of the subsection the language "within five days and no more than ten days from the application." shall be deleted and replaced with "within fourteen business days from the date of the application."



AN ORDINANCE TO WAIVE COMPETITIVE BIDDING AND AUTHORIZE CITY OF JONESBORO TO CONTRACT WITH GRACE COMMUNICATIONS TO INSTALL THE RADIO COMMUNICATIONS TOWER ON STRAWFLOOR ROAD

WHEREAS, the City of Jonesboro needs to install a new radio control tower on Strawfloor Road which will work with the existing system used by several City departments;

WHEREAS, the current system was programmed by Grace Communications and all systems need to operate together. If another company is used for the installation of this tower, all existing programming would have to be redone at a significant additional expense to the City;

WHEREAS, said services can be obtained from Grace Communications at a cost of \$25,611.56, a copy of said contract, invoice, and statement of work is attached.

WHEREAS, funding for the execution of the contract shall come from capital improvements budget and compensation shall be paid in accordance with the contract.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JONESBORO, ARKANSAS THAT:

SECTION 1: That the City Council in accord with the terms of A.C.A. Section 14-58-302 hereby waives the requirement of competitive bidding and directs the Purchasing Officer to purchase the above described services for the price set forth above.

SECTION 2: It is further found that due to the immediate need to acquire these services and install this tower, an emergency is declared to exist and this ordinance being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall take effect from and after its passage and approval.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 10 KNOWN AS THE ANIMALS ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR CHANGES IN THE ENFORCEMENT AND RULES AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY TO PROVIDE CLARITY IN THE EXISTING ORDINANCES

WHEREAS THE CITY OF JONESBORO DESIRES TO PROMOTE A HEALTHY ENVIRONMENT BY PREVENTING PUBLIC NUSIANCE CAUSED BY ODOR OR THE ATTRACTION OF UNDESIRABLE RODENTS OR INSECTS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF JONESBORO, ARKANSAS:

IT SHALL BE UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON TO KEEP ANY ANIMAL IN SUCH A MANNER AS TO ENDANGER THE PUBLIC HEALTH BY THE ACCUMULATION OF ANIMAL WASTE WHICH CAUSES FOUL AND OFFENSIVE ODORS ARE CONSIDERED TO BE A HAZARD TO OTHER ANIMALS OR HUMAN BEINGS.

SECTION I: CHAPTER 10-12 SHALL BE AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

Sec. 10-12. - Animal waste removal and disposal from properties.

(a) Purpose. To require the removal and disposal of animal feces deposited without permission on public and private property so as to protect public health, safety, and welfare, and to prescribe penalties for failure to comply.

(b) Violation. A violation occurs when an owner or custodian of an animal fails to immediately remove and to properly dispose of feces deposited by their animal on any public street, sidewalk, gutter, park or other publicly owned property or private property unless the owner of the property has given permission allowing such use of the property. Proper feces disposal shall be executed in accordance with "Chapter 54 - Solid Waste, Division 1 - Generally, Section 54-44 - Animal Waste"

(c) Exemptions. This section shall not apply to visually impaired persons who have charge, control, or use of guide dogs or persons using animals in conjunction with activities of law enforcement.
 (d) Enforcement. Representatives of the Police Department shall enforce the provisions of this chapter. Police Officers, Animal Control Officers and Code Enforcement Officers shall have the

authority to issue citation(s) to person(s) violating the provisions of this chapter within the Officers presence. If the Officer does not view the occurrence of the violation, the Officers will then advise the complaining property owner on an affidavit process and assist the complainant with any documentation received by this office.

(e) Penalty. Any person(s) who is found to be in violation of the provisions of this ordinance section shall be subject to a fine of \$75.00 for each occurrence.

SECTION II: All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION III: It is further found that due to the immediate need to provide clarity to the existing ordinances, an emergency is declared to exist and this ordinance being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, shall take effect from and after its passage and approval.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 30-24, EXCEPTIONS FOR LARGE TRACTS OF LAND, FOR THE CUTTING OF GRASS, WEEDS, BRUSH, VINES, ETC., WITHIN THE CODE THAT FORMERLY ALLOWED SPECIAL CONSIDERATION FOR LARGER TRACTS OF LAND AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY FOR THE REDUCTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCES AND THE PRESERVATION OF PUBLIC PEACE, HEALTH, AND SAFETY.

WHEREAS, the City of Jonesboro realizes large tracts of land exist within the commercial and neighborhood core areas of the City, which are not being maintained from a quality of life perspective, and have shown to foster the harboring and breeding of mosquitoes due to lack of yard maintenance.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JONESBORO, ARKANSAS THAT: Code Section 30-24 be amended as follows:

SECTION (1): Large Tracts of Land located in areas zoned C-1, C-2, C-3, C-4 and CR-1 shall not be exempt from maintenance and compliance of Section 30-31, Minimum requirements for weeds, vines, grass or low-hanging limbs.

SECTION (2): If the tract of land is shown to be a danger to the public peace, health and safety, the entire tract will be cut and such grass, weeds, brush, vines, etc. shall be cut below the 12 inches specified.

SECTION (3): It is further found that due to the immediate need to provide clarity to the existing ordinances, an emergency is declared to exist and this ordinance being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and the reduction in public nuisances shall take effect from and after its passage and approval.

- 3. That the Street Department is authorized to place the appropriate signs at the above locations.





City of Jonesboro Activity Report

July 2013

Vector Disease Control, Inc. (VDCI) provides a proven, scientific approach to mosquito control for the city of Jonesboro. VDCI's operations include larval and adult mosquito surveillance followed by the application of larvicides and adulticides. In addition, our office responds to service requests from the public.

Mosquito Surveillance

VDCI has utilized a total of thirteen (15) New Jersey light traps placed in residential and recreational areas throughout Jonesboro during this reporting period. These traps collected an average of 24.2 mosquitoes per trap night (1,551 total mosquitoes) during this time. There have been a total of 4 mosquito species collected, with *Anopheles quadrimaculatus* being the most predominant species.

Larval Control Activity

Permanent water, flood water, artificial containers, and drainage system sites are inspected for larval mosquito breeding on a regular basis. In total, 24 site inspections found the presence of mosquito larvae. As a result of these inspections 65.5 ounces of the larvicide Aquabac 200G was applied to these mosquito breeding sites. Additionally, VDCI is continuing to eliminate breeding habitats for artificial container mosquitoes by targeting bird baths, buckets, tires, etc.



ADULT MOSQUITO CONTROL ACTIVITY

In response to community events and mosquito surveillance data, VDCI applied Adulticide (19) truck nights for this reporting period. All adulticide ULV applications Were made with truck-mounted ULV units equipped with GPS-enabled monitors. During this report period, a total of 1,502.1 spray miles (64,809.6 acres) was treated With a total of 448.6 gallons of adulticide in residential and recreational areas. In Addition to routine truck spraying, VDCI has responded to 153 service request and Adulticided all parks and special events during this month.

Summary

During this reporting period, VDCI has continued to provide exceptional control of larval and adult mosquito populations. VDCI will remain diligent in our surveillance and control activities to prevent a significant increase in the mosquito population. Based on recent weather conditions VDCI expects the trend of routine adulticiding and larviciding to continue. However, if VDCI detects a significant rise in the mosquito population we will increase larval and adult control.
