SUPPLIMENTAL INSPECTION

THE HOME HAS BEEN BOARDED FOR 6 MONTHS. NO PERMITS HAVE BEEN PULLED AND NO WORK HAS BEEN DONE TO REPAIR THE HOME. THE HOME HAS DETERIEREATED MORE SINCE THE ORIGINAL INSPECTION. THIS DETERIORATION IS PRIMARLY DUE TO THE ROOF BEING OPEN FROM THE FIRE DAMAGE AND THE INTERIOR BEING OPEN TO THE ELEMENTS. THE ROOF LINE WAS STARTING TO SAG DUE TO THE DAMAGE TO THE JOISTS. THE HOME IS A HAZARD TO THE HEALTH, WELFARE, AND SAFETY OF THE PUBLIC. THE HOME SHOULD BE RAZED IMMEDIATELY TO ENSURE THE SAFETY OF LOCAL CHILDREN AND OTHER CITIZENS, NOT TO MENTION THE BLIGHT TO THE COMMUNITY. PROPERTY WAS SECURED AT THE TIME OF INSPECTION.
